What to do if something goes wrong online?

This week we are sharing two short, helpful videos from Internet Matters that may support parents/carers with conversations at home.

The first video looks at **what to do if a stranger contacts your child online**, and the second focuses on **what to do if your child is bullied online**. Both videos are quick to watch and give clear, practical advice on how to respond calmly, reassure your child, save evidence, report concerns and get further support if needed.

These situations can feel worrying, but the most important message for children is that they can come to a trusted adult without fear of getting into trouble. Regular, calm conversations about who they are speaking to online, what to do if something feels uncomfortable, and how to block/report can make a big difference.
